More than 300 career choices in agriculture. The Louisiana Farm Bureau Foundation offers you 2,000 reasons to study one of them.

The Farm Bureau is a voluntary organization of farm and ranch families that works to achieve legislative and economic benefits for its members. Through its strength as the state's largest general farm organization, it is the "Voice of Louisiana Agriculture" for all matters important to farmers, their families, agribusiness and others who share our philosophy.

We are vitally interested in having the business of agriculture run by future generations of farm and ranch families. To this end, we have formed a tax-exempt foundation to award scholarships to deserving students pursuing careers in agriculture.

The first two Louisiana Farm Bureau scholarships were awarded in 1993. Since then, Farm Bureau has awarded 135 scholarships — for a total of \$199,500 — to assist graduating seniors in their first year of college.

In 2015 we will award ten \$2,000 scholarships to applicants nominated by the parish Farm Bureaus. Seven will be awarded to the highest-scoring applicants based on grade point average, ACT scores, individual achievement in high school, participation in parish and state Farm Bureau activities and financial need. The remaining three scholarships will be awarded through a random drawing from our remaining parish winners. Scholarships will be awarded in two \$1,000 payments to qualifying winners.

We invite you, the seniors of 2015, to review the eligibility requirements at right. If you qualify, obtain an application from your local Farm Bureau office, complete it and return it to the same office. Each parish will select one applicant to be submitted for consideration as a state winner.

Scholarship ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

- Applicants must have a cumulative grade point average of 2.5 or better for four years of high school.
- Applicants must be graduating from high school in the spring of 2015.
- Applicants must attend an accredited college or university in Louisiana during the fall and spring semesters immediately following his or her graduation from high school.
- Applicants must pursue a curriculum in agriculture, vocational agriculture, agribusiness, agriscience, home economics or other curriculum directly benefiting the agricultural sector of Louisiana's economy.
- A scholarship winner must earn a grade point average of 2.5 or better during his or her first semester of college and maintain a major course of study in agriculture for the second semester in order to receive the second half of the scholarship award.
