College is costly. The Louisiana Farm Bureau Foundation can give you 1,500 reasons to worry less.

The Farm Bureau is a voluntary organization of farm and ranch families that works to achieve legislative and economic benefits for its members. Through its strength as the state's largest general farm organization, it is the "Voice of Louisiana Agriculture" for all matters important to farmers, their families and others who share our philosophy.

We are vitally interested in having the business of agriculture run by future generations of farm and ranch families. To this end, we have formed a tax-exempt foundation to award scholarships to deserving students pursuing careers in agriculture.

Since the first two scholarships were awarded in 1993, Farm Bureau has awarded 105 scholarships — for a total of \$149,500 — to assist graduating seniors in their first year of college. In 2012 we will award ten \$1,500 scholarships to applicants nominated by the parish Farm Bureaus. Six of these scholarships will be awarded to the highest scoring applicants based on grade point average, ACT scores, individual achievement in high school, participation in parish and state Farm Bureau activities and financial need. The four additional scholarship winners will be decided in a random drawing from our remaining parish winners.

We invite the seniors of 2012 to review the eligibility requirements at right. If you qualify, obtain an application from your local Farm Bureau office, complete it and return it to the same office. Each parish will select one applicant to be submitted for consideration as a state winner.

Scholarship Eligibility Requirements

- Applicants must have a cumulative grade point average of 2.5 or better for four years of high school.
- Applicants must be graduating from high school in the spring of 2012.
- Applicants must attend an accredited college or university in Louisiana during the fall and spring semesters immediately following his or her graduation from high school.
- Applicants must pursue a curriculum in agriculture, vocational agriculture, agribusiness, agriscience, home economics or other curriculum directly benefiting the agricultural sector of Louisiana's economy.
- A scholarship winner must earn a grade point average of 2.5 or better during his or her first semester of college and maintain a major course of study in agriculture for the second semester in order to receive the second half of the scholarship award.
